

Camphor Hanover defeats females at Scioto

Camphor Hanover used a swift third-quarter brush to take control and win the Fillies and Mares Open Pace at Scioto Downs on Friday night. She was eased to the wire 3-1/4 lengths the best in 1:54.1.

The daughter of Island Fantasy defeated Andi Andi and Rare Filly. The winner was driven by Jeremy Smith for trainer Virgil Morgan, Jr. and owner Jerome Waddell of California.

Camphor Hanover was sent off at 1-2 odds after pre-race favorite JL's Red Star was scratched sick.

In the next race, the 3-year-old trotter Zippen Chip by Chip Chip Hooray came from ninth place in the final quarter to win by a half-length for trainer-driver Sandy Beatty. The gelding had post nine in the 10-horse field and Beatty kept him at the back of the pack before moving him three-wide in the final quarter.

Zippen Chip zipped by eight trotters to hit the wire first in 2:00.2.
